It provides an introduction for each the signal greatest factor in the development of a disciple of Christ. Therefore we want to encourage you to take what you have learned from the "Read The Bible for Life" campaign and continue the practice of reading God's Word everyday 2018. We want to encourage you to join us as we read the entire Bible next year and with the use of one of the following tools you will find a method that works best for you.

- 1. Use a printed Bible reading plan that will be provided for next year.
- 2. Purchase and use the "Readers Guide To The Bible" by George Guthrie. This is a companion for reading through the Bible in one year. As you read Scripture in suggested chronological, daily segments, this guide will offer brief comments that will help you understand what you read: identify the significance of bible Characters, places and events; and recognize how each passage fits in the grand story of Scripture.
- 3. Purchase and use HCSB Reading God's Story: A Chronological Daily Bible. Reading God's Story is organized into 52 weeks of readings.

reading so you can grasp its importance in the grand story.

- 4. Install You Version Bible App or go to their Website and use George Guthrie's Reading God's Story: One-Year Chronological Plan.
- 5. If you don't have time to read we will make available a audio Bible reading plan that was created for George Guthrie's Plan. The audio plan is a free app for I phone users and can be accessed by other devices via the web. We plan to make it available on our Facebook page and website as well.

The Goal is to give you as many access points as possible to make the process of reading God's Word a part of everyday of your life. Hopefully through the use of one or more of the tools and with encouragement and accountability our entire church will finish 2018 having read God's great story.





Daycare News

Just saying "no" doesn't always work. How to get your child to live and learn -- and not lose your cool in

I came across this excellent article concerning toddlers and some of their challenging behavior. I hope it is helpful to those that find themselves trying to navigate this minefield!

Order and routine give young children a safe haven from what they view as an overwhelming and unpredictable world, Lerner says. "When there's some predictability and routine, it makes children feel much more safe and secure, and they tend to be much more behaved and calm because they know what to expect."

2. Avoid Stressful Situations

By the time your child has reached the toddler stage, you've spent enough time with him or her to know what triggers reactions. The most common ones are hunger, sleepiness, and quick changes of venue. Avoid these potential meltdown scenarios with a little advance planning.

3. Think Like a Toddler

Toddlers aren't mini-adults. They have trouble understanding many of the things we take for granted, like how to follow directions and behave appropriately. Seeing the scenario from a toddler's perspective can help prevent a

4. Practice the Art of Distraction

Make your toddler's short attention span work for you. When your child throws the ball against the dining room wall for the 10th time after you've said to stop, it's pretty easy to redirect your child to a more productive activity, like trading the ball for a favorite book or moving the game outside.

5. Give Your Child a Break

Time-outs are one of the foundations of child discipline, but they may not be the best approach for the toddler stage The negative implication of being sent away can teach kids that they're bad rather than promote good behavior. A alternative is creating a "cozy corner," a safe place free from distractions and stimulation where your child can just chill out for a few minutes until he or she can get back in control. That time away can help you regroup as well.

It's easy for your blood pressure to reach the boiling point when you're in the middle of watching your child throw a tantrum. But losing control will quickly escalate an already stressful situation. Give yourself some time to cool off, Forehand says. "Otherwise, you're venting your own anger. In the end that's going to make you, as a parent, feel worse and guilty. And it's not going to do your child any good."

7. Know When to Give In

Certain things in a toddler's life are nonnegotiable. She has to eat, brush her teeth, and ride in a car seat. She also has to take baths once in a while. Hitting and biting are never OK. But many other issues aren't worth the headache of an argument. Pick your battles.

Finally, know that it's OK to feel stressed out by your toddler sometimes. "Realize that none of us as parents is perfect -- we do the best we can. There are going to be days that we're better at this than other days," Forehand says. "But if we parent consistently and have consistent rules, then we're going to see more good days than bad days."
