As our year began I challenged you to be a "traveler" in God's Word – one who looked for the meaning and significance of the content of Scripture as you travel through it.

As a church family we are gathering together each week to discuss the chronological portion of God's Word that we have read the previous week, with an end to:

- 1. Read / glean what God has to say about Himself and what He desires from each of us.
- 2. Search the Scriptures and develop a reverence-based relationship with Him.
- 3. Be motivated in that relationship to obey Him and serve as He commands and directs.

Are you onboard with us? You can jump onboard next week and take this journey with us!

Folks like to do all sort of curious things while they are traveling – read, play game, color (yes, it's popular again!), listen to music, watch movies, or even sleep (only while not driving, please!).

*Pray

Discipleship **Ministry**


We are 60 plus days into our Chronological Reading Plan of the Bible. I am very excited to hear many positive comments about how the Read the Bible for Life Plan is impacting so many lives. Comments such as; "I have never read this before" to "I have a greater understanding of passage now". It is truly amazing how God will work in our lives if we will make life space and heart space for Him in our daily lives.

Researchers suggest that it takes on average 66 days to create a habit for something that is not all that difficult, such as, drinking a glass of water with your breakfast. However, for more difficult task the time required can increase dramatically. For some this habit of making life space comes easily and for others it is much more difficult. Wherever you find yourself on the scale of difficulty, may I encourage you to keep going, keep trying, do not give up! Making changes to our normal routines can be very difficult and many people have busy lives. Just making the life space in your schedule can be the hardest part of this important discipline.

As you are working on creating or continuing this discipline we are trying to support you by providing wonderful tools, such as the My Wordserach website that offers over 28 biblical helps all to support your reading... and it's free! Also we offer Right Now Media as a free resources to you and make suggestion on the Church's Facebook page of videos that we believe will enhance your understanding of the reading as well. Then we encourage everyone to be involved in a small group that meets every Sunday morning to discuss what we have read and what we are learning. You will find encouragement and accountability in these groups which is proven to help you stay on course.

It has been determined that the single greatest influence on the maturing process for disciples is reading the Bible on a daily basis. Studies have determined that only about 18% of people who claim to be believers practice this discipline. Our goal is to help as many people as we can become maturing believers. Moving through the process of being a hearer of the Word to become a doer of the Word starts with making life space and heart space.

I've found a great blog, "Path Through the Narrow Gate", that helps and encourages family bible reading and study. I wanted to share this article with parents and grandparents of elementary aged children.



4 Practical Ways To Encourage Your Kids to Read the Bible... for Themselves!

1. Set a good example.

If you want to help your children learn to read the Bible every day, you need to set a good example for them. Make sure that you are in God's Word every day, and let your kids see you doing this.

2. Buy your kids their very own Bibles.

There's something so special about having our own copies of God's Word. If your child is in first grade or older, you may want to buy them an actual Bible – not a Bible story book. They are not too young to start reading and understanding passages from God's Word.

- 3. Help your kids Know where to start reading. If your kids are just getting started reading the Bible for themselves, help them to know where to start. (Hint: The Gospels are a great place to start for young readers!)
- Read with them.

Another great way to encourage your kids to read the Bible independently is to read the same passage each day that they are reading. You can hold each other accountable and ask each other questions about the passage.

As you read the same passages with your children, you can also discuss what God is teaching you in the passage or how that passage can be applied to your lives.
