

Pastor's Ponderings

Of Kings And Kingdoms...

On an OT exam, a seminary student was asked to write what he knew about the various kings of Israel and Judah. He listed as many of them as he could remember and wrote out beside each name "he did what was evil in the Lord's sight." He passed! He passed because nearly all the kings of Israel and Judah from Solomon to Zedekiah were bad kings and ultimately failed to fully follow the Lord.

One area of sin into which so many fell was that they "failed to remove the high places" – Canaanite "ridges" or elevated hilltop areas where the Canaanite gods were worshiped. God repeatedly told His people to destroy these altars and idols. Instead they often "jewishized" them – kept them and used them as a place to worship Yahweh God.

One grave danger believers face today is "syncretism" – to combine 2 or more different beliefs or faith practices into one. In other words, we pull things we like from other religions or beliefs and make them a part of our own faith and practice. Instead of "pure and undefiled religion" (James 1:27) we mix a whole bunch of religious ingredients together until we have a stew that tastes like we want it to taste!

Let's keep the gospel – and our heart / life before the Lord – simple, pure, and un-blended. Hold firmly to the truth of Scripture – truths like 1Cor.15:3-4 – ... Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that He was buried, that He was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures. And truths like 2Cor.5:21 – He made the One who did not know sin to be sin for us, so that we might become the righteousness of God in Him.

Keep reading the Word folks and learn more of His Kingdom!
