




Ladies Mid-Week Study:

"Many are the plans in a man's heart, but it is the Lord's purpose that prevails." (Proverbs 19:21) I am learning from our Lord more and more each day that even though my plans may be for the good of His kingdom and church, it is ultimately only His plans that really matter. I must gladly submit to His will and sometimes just wait on Him. It is only by His great love and mercy that we awaken each morning. "Because of the Lord's great love we are not consumed, for his compassions never fail. They are new every morning; great is your faithfulness. (Lamentations 3:22-23)

You may have heard that recently my white blood cell count and neutrophils count have plummeted to dangerous levels and I am now neutropenic with no immunity. That is why the doctors have recommended that I stay at home and avoid all public places. I was so looking forward to continuing to lead worship with you, and especially on our Old Settlers Sunday, but I will not be able to be there. The Lord has led us to seek more individualized treatment options at a well-known cancer center in Irvine, CA, the largest one of it's kind in North America. They will do extensive testing with my blood to pinpoint exactly how it

responds to over 50 different treatment options. In order to minimize my exposure to people we have graciously been loaned an RV. My son Matthew will drive us there. My first appointment is Monday morning September 10th. Amazingly, Irvine is also where my niece and her husband live and they have offered for us to stay in their home. God is working out the details day by day.

We ask that you please continue to pray fervently for us and for the doctors there. We don't know God's plan for me and my health, but we know that we are secure in His loving hands! "We wait in hope for the Lord; he is our help and our shield. In him our hearts rejoice, for we trust in his holy name. May your unfailing love rest upon us, O Lord, even as we put our hope in you." (Psalm 33:20-22)
