In Acts 4:11-12

Here Peter is talking to the Sanhedrin, who were trying to get him on the charge of preaching blasphemy. He does two things:

1. Peter calls them out for rejecting Jesus.

The religious elite all rejected Jesus as the Savior because they had it in their minds that Jesus would come as a warrior and not as an average person. In truth, you can't really blame them; even in today's society, we never expect a small person to be a leader or someone who is soft-spoken to be the powerhouse of an argument. We want our leaders to be big and bold; we think that is the only way for true leaders to be. When in reality, often times, the ones who are humble and don't take all the credit are the best leaders. In the case of the Israelites, they thought the Savior would bring them out of their physical condition, not their spiritual enslavement. The irony is that Jesus was a carpenter by trade. So, the fact that he was responsible for building our salvation was lost on the people of the time and, to some extent, on the people of today. Peter calls Jesus the cornerstone. Corner stones are the part of the building that holds up the building. Without one, everything comes crashing down. In today's terms, Jesus is the foundational slab. A poor slab can cause the building to be a bad building. Without Jesus as the foundation, we cannot stand for long and will crumble under the weight of sin and society.


2. Peter explained that Jesus is the only way to salvation.

Even when Peter is calling out the Sanhedrin for rejecting the very person who is the foundation of our salvation, he takes the time to remind them just who Jesus is. There is only one way to be in the presence of God. There is a popular saying, "All roads lead to Rome." This saying means that no matter what path you take, you will eventually get to your destination. That is not the case with salvation; people will say that there are different paths to "enlightenment," but for our salvation there is only one. Jesus said it, and Peter repeats it here to the people around him. The key, though, is that he was not ashamed of it, and even when faced with being beaten and put in prison for the rest of his life, he boldly declared it.

So, we must ask ourselves, "Are we ready to follow Jesus and declare him Lord of all?" Even when faced with social or physical persecution or discrimination?
