


A Church that equips you to be “Faithful & Fruitful.”

The last phases of our re-construction are beginning now. Please excuse our mess as we near the end of these projects.


Pray for our Associate Pastor of Worship & Administration Search Committee as they continue to deal with a candidate for that position of service in our church. God’s timing is always perfect!



1 Corinthians 4

Paul writes a letter to the Corinthian church and is calling them out for their sins and for the failings. Here is one of the most interesting chapters in the whole book. Paul gives three major points to this chapter;

1. Just because he is a leader doesn't make him better.
2. Don't be full of pride in your accomplishments.
3. Love someone enough to correct them/ call them out.

We have to ask ourselves; why does he do this? I think the answer is simple. He knows that people are listening to him simply because he is Paul and the founder of their church and really responsible for the spread of the Gospel. However, he does not want people to think of him as a high and mighty person, he wants people to know that he is just as worthless and just as sinful as everyone else. He uses two very interesting terms in verse 1, he calls himself a "servant." This is the lowest of the low (a slave if you will) but then he calls himself a "Steward". This means he is responsible for the spread and upkeep of the Gospel.

He then goes and talks about not being too proud to act as a servant of Christ. Nothing we have comes from ourselves it comes from God and his blessings. When we start to think that our success and riches come from us, we are mistaken. (This does not mean you will be rich and successful in this life when you follow Christ). What Paul is saying is that it is hard for people who hold status in the world to give up their status to follow Jesus (i.e., the rich young ruler).

Finally, Paul makes the statement at the end of this chapter that is like a mic drop. "Shall I come to you with a rod, or with love and a spirit of gentleness?" He is saying that because he loves the people of Corinth that it is his duty to call them out when they are faltering, in love though. We shouldn't be hateful or hurtful when it comes to correction. When we do it out of love that is the best way. People may get upset but that's ok. (This does not mean we have free reign to talk to people however we like, this is a process. This is just to show us that we must keep each other accountable, even leadership).
